

TEACHER CREDENTIAL REQUIREMENTS

AIP Bylaws

III.4.4. Certified Parliamentarian-Teacher; Certified Professional Parliamentarian-Teacher. A certified parliamentarian or a certified professional parliamentarian may be credentialed as a teacher of parliamentary procedure by successfully completing a program developed and maintained by the Education Department. The credential shall be awarded by the Accrediting Department on behalf of AIP. As appropriate, the individual so accredited may use the title Certified Parliamentarian-Teacher (CP-T) or Certified Professional Parliamentarian-Teacher (CPP-T).

Teaching Credential Requirements:

In order to achieve the "T" credential, members must (1) successfully complete an AIP teachers' course and (2) provide documentation to the Accrediting Department of at least fifteen points of approved teaching experience. Candidates who can provide evidence of one of the following criteria may be excused from the teachers' course requirement by the Education Department:

- Having earned a degree a post-secondary degree in education, communication, or fields closely associated to teaching and learning (B.A., B.S., M.S., Ed.D., Ph.D., etc.)
- Be currently employed full time as an educator at an accredited secondary or postsecondary institution.
- Provide a degree transcript showing completion of a course in or closely related to teaching and learning (minimum of 3 academic credits)

Upon successful completion of the Teacher Certification Course and the accumulation of sufficient teaching points after the earning of their CP designation, candidates applying for teaching certification shall complete the attached forms and submit them to AIP headquarters. A candidate may not use the CP-T or CPP-T credential until awarded by the Accrediting Department on behalf of AIP.

Teaching Experience

Teaching experience must be performed (1) after completion of the teachers' course; (2) after award of at least a CP credential; and (3) within the prior five years immediately of this application.

The qualified teaching experience:

- Shall be performed for a class of at least seven students;
- Shall be provided on a subject of parliamentary procedure (subject to final determination by the Accrediting Department);
- May involve the same material taught to different groups of students, however, the Accrediting Department may require that teaching experience occur in more than one type of education setting.
- Need not necessarily be performed in a "formal" classroom setting; workshops, community education programs, etc. may be counted.
- May be presented either in-person or virtually.

Activities performed at a AIP-sponsored educational event or at an Annual Session shall be identified by date and event, and shall not require further documentation. Activities performed

for other organizations shall require validation documentation.

Documentation, shall include the following:

- Date of activity
- Name and type of organization
- Activity time (hours or partial hours)
- Format of educational session (lecture, workshop, etc.)
- Validation of participation in activity (certificate, agenda, letter, invoice, etc.)

Teaching Activity Definitions

Activity	Definition
Teaching at an AIP parliamentary education course.	An AIP-sponsored course or workshop not conducted in conjunction with an Annual Session or Practicum (i.e. Chapter meeting)
Staff or lead instructor at an AIP Practicum.	Instructors responsible for the detailed content and instruction at a Practicum.
Instructor for an AIP workshop or seminar.	An Annual Session or a single workshop at a Practicum.
Instructor for the AIP Correspondence Course.	Tutor for a student assigned by the Correspondence Course Division Chair.
Teaching one term or semester parliamentary course for credit in college or university.	A course taught for credit at an accredited institution
Teaching a parliamentary workshop or course for non-AIP meeting or convention.	Generally understood to be at a meeting of any other organization
Teaching at an approved parliamentary event.	A course or workshop not conducted in conjunction with an Annual Session or Practicum such as a Unit meeting
Develop an approved education course.	A course covering a broad range of topics related to parliamentary procedure.
Other parliamentary teaching activities.	Category for activities not fiting into previous categories but still a teaching activity

Forms Required

The forms required to be submitted are:

- (1) The Application for AIP Teacher Credential, with completed attestation;
- (2) a completed Teaching Activities Record; and
- (3) documentation of non-AIP activities.

Completed forms are to be submitted to aip@aipparl.org. Members are responsible for maintaining copies of all documents. Copies will not be maintained by AIP or the Accrediting or Education Departments.
